Now they're bringing all of this to Reston Town Center, with the October 2008 opening of PassionFish (exact opening date and details about an exclusive preview for GRCC members are coming soon).

PassionFish is the next generation, twenty-first century rendition of the group's first restaurant, DC Coast, taking its tri-coastal seafood theme to a global level. The menu and food concept are driven by nationally recognized chef Jeff Tunks, whose 'passion' lies in sourcing a premier selection of seafood for his establishments. With a cultivated palate based on his 25 years' experience in the kitchen, Tunks continues to present surprising and creative choices on an ever changing seasonal basis. The cuisine of PassionFish will represent the bounty of the world's oceans, lakes, seas, and waterways reflecting the flavors and natural resources of the Mediterranean, Europe, Asia, and the Americas. The dishes will feature a vast array of seasonal fresh seafood, distinctive flavors, and simply elegant presentations.

The décor is anchored by an impressive chilled seafood station in the center of the main dining room juxtaposed by a dramatic "floating" glass staircase accentuating the contemporary setting. PassionFish is located at the corner of Democracy Drive and Explorer Street, in the lower level of the Rolls Royce building. The restaurant's floor-to-ceiling windows illuminate the grand dining area, while offering views of passers-by and the tranquil community park. Banquet rooms, both large and small, present private sanctuaries with windows overlooking the large green space.
